Sports Premium Funding: Spending During 2014-2015

During the last school year we received a Sports Grant of $\pm 9,380$ which we used to pay for:

- Membership of the Telford and Wrekin Sports Partnership which gave our pupils the opportunity to take part in a wide range of sporting activities
- Outdoor education activities
- A designated sports coach to lead lunch time activities
- Outside providers to extend the range and breadth of sports offered
- Replacement gymnastics equipment
- A large climbing frame, including ropes and wall-bars. (Part-funded by our "Friends" (PTA))
- Equipment and playground markings to be used for lunch time sport and games - including Jumping Jaxx. (Part-funded by our "Friends" (PTA))
- Coaches to transport pupils to sporting events
- Coach to transport pupils to swimming lessons (spring term)
- Staff training
- Large feather flag to identify the place for pupils and parents to meet at large sporting events

We are very proud to have a trophy cabinet full of trophies won by our competitive teams and are happy that the majority of our pupils are inspired to be involved in a range of PE and sport, both in and out of school. We are also very proud to one of very few primary schools in Telford and Wrekin who have been awarded a Gold Award that recognises the high level of participation of our pupils, the high quality of our curriculum provision and the opportunities offered through our sports clubs and teams. This has been awarded to our school for the last three consecutive years.

Sports Premium Funding: Planned Spending for 2015-2016

This year our Sports Grant is £9,900

During the current school year our Sports Premium funding will be used to pay for:

- Annual subscription to enable the school to be part of the Telford and Wrekin Sports Partnership. Membership includes: regular input from a School Sports Co-ordinator, entry into many varied local sporting events throughout the year, such as athletics tournaments, large cross country events, multi-skills competitions, cricket, tag rugby and swimming
- Arthog outreach: outdoor education sessions e.g. rock climbing and canoeing for children throughout KS2 and for all Y6 pupils who do not attend our annual residential outdoor education week at Arthog in West Wales.
- Training for members of our lunchtime team to lead lunch time activities, such as football, basketball and tag rugby and to develop our Change for Life Club
- Outside providers, e.g. Chance to Shine cricket sessions and archery
- Replacement sports equipment
- Repairs to our outdoor adventure playgrounds
- Equipment to be used for lunch time sport and games including Jumping Jaxx.
- Coaches to transport pupils to sporting events
- Coach to transport pupils to swimming lessons (spring term)
- Staff CPD especially for our new team members
