This has been a very busy and successful year for Dothill Primary school. The Governors are very pleased to report that the Ofsted visit in October 2018 resulted in a judgement of *GOOD*, which we feel was very well deserved. We would like to thank the Headteacher, Senior Leaders, all staff and pupils for their hard work towards achieving this result. The inspectors reported that they noted that the children were focussed and engaged and demonstrated positive attitudes to their learning. They are proud to attend the school. Parents agreed that their children are safe, happy, well looked after and make good progress. The school is friendly and supportive. The report comments that the Governors have high expectations and are fully involved. They are forward thinking and have a positive impact on school improvement.

Holding the Headteacher to account for the educational performance of the school and its pupils

The October 2018 Ofsted report states that Governors regularly analyse data about pupil outcomes and visit regularly to check the impact of leaders' work. They offer leaders appropriate support, but also challenge them by asking evaluative questions about aspects of school improvement.

Following the Ofsted visit, Governors have collaborated closely with senior leaders on developing a three- year School Improvement Plan.

Overseeing the financial performance of the school and ensuring the allocated budgets are well spent

Each year the full Governing Body scrutinises and ultimately approves the school budget which is then closely monitored throughout the year. Governors also monitor the use of other sources of funding which include the Pupil Premium Grant and Sports Funding and question the impact of all additional funds.

Ensuring Statutory Duties are met

One of the most important roles that governors fulfil is ensuring the safety and well-being of all of the children who attend our school. There is a nominated governor for Safeguarding who liaises with senior staff regularly and reports to Governors meetings. Additionally the Headteacher to governors and answers questions arising from the report. The Safeguarding Squad continue to be an asset to the school. Ofsted report that the culture of Safeguarding is strong. Safeguarding is a high priority and a regular item in staff meetings.

PE and Sport

- Platinum School Games Award. This is presented to schools that have achieved the Gold award for five consecutive years. Dothill is the first school in Telford to receive continuous Platinum Awards.
- Achieved second place in the Telford Schools Swimming Gala in a closely fought contest.
- Pupils can now join the Leading Lights Dance Group.

The school choir have taken part in the Telford Sings event at Oakengates Town Hall. They have also visited Charlton School and performed at Wellington Midsummer Fair.



ECO Schools and the Environment

Our very close links with the Dothill Nature Reserve continue. We are the only school in Telford, and one of very few in the country, where every child is a junior member of the Nature Reserve. The environmental work of our school was again reported on Countryfile and also in the Daily Telegraph.

The Annual Arthog residential trip took place in October 2018. As part of this week all pupils were successful in achieving the John Muir Environmental Award.

Academic Achievements

Key Stage 2

Key Stage 2 SATs took place in May 2019. The results of our year 6 cohort are:

Attainment

This shows the percentage of our pupils that gained a standardised score of 100+
This is considered to be the age appropriate expectation.

Standardised Score

The RAW score that each child attains in a test is converted into a standardised score in order to compare to other children nationally. Our schools average standardised scores in the tests are as follows:

School Progress

When the Year 6 cohort were in Key Stage 1 they were given a level for their SAT result. This level has been converted into points, which are measured against the number of points received in the Key Stage 2 SATs. This gives a progress measure.
