Remote Learning - Our Offer to You - EYFS

- In accordance with DFE guidance we offer your child, in EYFS, two to three hours of remote learning each day. This will be provided during a national or local lockdown, or a bubble closure.
- Your child's remote education will be provided daily via the online platform Seesaw, this is a resource familiar to all children in school. Pupils have an account and log in details - if you have any issues with logging in, then please contact the school through the EYFS email address.
- Your child's teacher will provide clear explanations of the learning, this could include videos and/or examples to support your child/ren. Videos could be the teacher, taken from Oak Academy (recommended by the DFE for primary schools) or YouTube.
- Your child should attempt to complete work, on the day that it has been set by the class teacher. Work that is completed from previous days may not receive a comment but will be approved and looked at.
- Work can be completed directly onto Seesaw or be uploaded in a variety of ways. Seesaw allows you to upload photos, drawing, videos, notes and add links directly through the app. You can also upload a folder, for example, a document or photo you have saved to the device you are using.
- Seesaw is available on a range of devices, it functions on mobile phone, laptop, tablets, and iPad. If you are experiencing problems due to lack of device or sharing of devices between your children, then please contact the school.
- Daily feedback will be provided to each child - this will be a combination of likes, verbal, and written feedback. This will be a mixture of positive praise and developmental feedback to further develop and support the learning. Feedback will be provided by the class teachers during the school day. Work uploaded in an evening will not be approved or marked until the next working day.
- Each child will be invited to a daily, 9:30am, TEAMS face to face session with their teacher. We would like all children to join this session.
- Teachers will monitor how regularly your child is accessing Seesaw and completing work. If regular work is not being uploaded the class teacher will call to offer support.
