## **HISTORY**

- 2005 The School Sport Partnership Programme in Telford & Wrekin was introduced.
- 2011—2020 School Games. An initiative that has a focus
  on engaging all pupils in a COMPETITIVE SPORTS
  programme at four different levels. These include Intra
  (within schools), Inter (with other schools), County, and
  National levels.
  - 2013—2020 PE and sport premium funding introduced to help increase and improve PE and sports opportunities for primary school children.





### Where are we now?

- We have an opportunity to develop an OUTSTANDING
   Physical Education and School Sport Strategy for all
   young people attending Dothill Primary School.
- Dothill Primary School are members of the Telford & Wrekin School Sports Partnership in association with Telford Langley and Burton Borough Secondary Schools. In addition, we liaise with the School Sports Coordinator at Charlton Secondary School.
- We receive £19,240 ring fenced sport premium funding September 2019—August 2020.
  - Both the PE Coordinator (September 2019) and Lead
     Governor for PE (April 2018) are both new to the roles.





# **PE and Sport Premium**

The PE and Sport Premium funding Dothill Primary School receive is provided jointly by the Department for Education, the Department for Health and Culture and the Department for Media and Sport.

It has been directly allocated to primary school schools and is ring-fenced, meaning that it can only be spent on the provision of PE and sport in schools. The funding is being provided until 2020.

Funding is provided for primary schools to spend on improving the quality of PE and sport for all their children and compliments the existing School Games programme.

Funding for schools is calculated by the number of pupils on roll as of the annual schools census in January 2019.

Funding has been doubled until August 2020 which entitles Dothill Primary School to £16,000 and an additional payment of £10 per pupil.



# **Purpose of the Funding**

Dothill Primary School will spend the PE and School Sport Premium on improving our provision of PE and School Sport. We aim to use the funding effectively to ensure that standards of learning and achievement in PE and Sports are raised for all children, regardless of their background, enabling them to engage in physical activity as part of our curricular and extra-curricular provision.

During the last academic year, Dothill Primary School has used the funding to pay for:

- Annual subscription to the Telford & Wrekin School Sport Partnership.
- Outdoor Adventurous Activities.
- Staff attending external and internal professional development sessions.
- Buying quality assured professional development modules and materials for PE/sport.
- Sports clubs and competitive activities have been subsidised allowing a wide range of sports activities to be offered to the children.
- PE and sporting equipment has been replaced and enhanced.
- Providing enhanced PE/sport opportunities for PPG and SEND children.





# **Accountability**

Dothill Primary School are held to account for how the PE and School Sport Premium is spent:

- Ofsted assesses how primary schools use the primary PE and sport premium. They measure its impact on pupil outcomes, and how effectively governors hold school leaders to account for this.
- Dothill Primary School provides details about its sporting provision on its website alongside curriculum details, so parents can compare sports provision between schools both within and beyond the school day.
- Dothill Primary School Governors hold the Headteacher to account regarding to the effective and efficient use of the premium funding.
- The School Games Organiser regularly consults with Dothill Primary School to advise on the PE and School Sport funding. Furthermore, the School Games Organiser is responsible for verifying Dothill's annual School Games Mark application.





### Who assists us?

- The Telford & Wrekin School Sport Partnership has a successful track record in supporting our school to deliver the National PE and School Sport Strategy.
- As members of the Telford & Wrekin School Sport
   Partnership, we receive a termly programme of provision
   that supports Dothill Primary School in the delivery of
   an outstanding PE and School Sport Strategy.
- We attend termly PE Coordinator meeting where the needs of our young people and staff are addressed and where we are given a platform to share our good practice with other schools.
- External deliverers extend the range and breadth of sports offered at Dothill. These currently include Leading Lights Dance Club and Headstart.
- The experienced team of outdoor practitioners working at Arthog support Dothill Primary School to deliver high quality outdoor and adventurous education when pupils take part in a residential trip in Year 6. The Friends of Dothill also work closely with staff at Dothill to deliver a range of outdoor activities on and around our local nature reserve.





### **Our Vision and Aims**

- To improve the quality and quantity of PE and School Sport at Dothill Primary School.
- To access curriculum support and professional development opportunities provided by the Telford & Wrekin School Sport Partnership in order to enhance Dothill's PE curriculum and programme of out of school hours learning.
- To enable participation at all levels of school sport developing young people physically, cognitively, personally, socially and creatively.
- To create school competition in a wide range of sports and enhance our own Intra School Games competitions.
- To continue and embrace the Olympic Legacy and see the values of London 2012 embedded in school.
- To ensure value for money in the delivery of School Sport through collaborative planning at a strategic level.

- Coordination and provision of CPD opportunities for teachers, support staff and coaches.

#### Out of School Hours Learning

- Access to a range of Quality Assured Community
   Sports Coaches / Teachers to deliver Lunchtime/
   Afterschool Clubs with provision of units of work to
   ensure sustainable delivery.
- Secondary Out Reach the opportunity for primary children to attend feeder secondary schools and/or secondary staff to attend primary schools to deliver units of work.

#### Competition and Talent

- Representation on the Telford & Wrekin Primary Schools Sports Association.
- Production of annual and termly calendars of competitions to facilitate Intra and Inter school sport competition.
- Delivery of School Sport Games Intra and Inter school competition local to county provision.
- Coordination, management and delivery of additional festivals and events including: Key Stage 1 fundamentals, Dance festival, virtual competitions including KS1 sports festival.
- Establish a player pathway within new competition framework.
- Guidance in delivering Olympic style Intra school Sports Days.
- Projectability & County Athlete Assessment Days inclusive programme delivery through liaison with the
  County Sports Partnership.

#### Leadership

- Jumping Jaxx leader training including activity cards.
- Year 5/6 Change 4 Life leadership day.
- Playground Pals leader training for KS1.
- Young Ambassador training.

#### Raising Achievement

- Planning, assessment and practical opportunities for core curriculum through the medium of sport—eg Active Literacy / Active Numeracy.
- Promotion of initiatives including National School
   Sports Week, Change 4 Life and Active 30 minutes.
- Access to a data base of externally based sports providers.
- Provision of annual School Games Mark awards.

#### Participation and Engagement

- Providing additional opportunities through National Governing Bodies to provide sport specific projects within and between other schools. E.g. Chance to Shine, Golf Roots and Wildcats Centres.
- Modelling bids for external funding and equipment. E.g. Football Foundation, Awards 4 All.
- To promote community based opportunities for pupils by providing information on local clubs.
- Liaison with Public Health teams to support the use of physical activity a preventative tool.
- Guidance for the implementation of Active Play / TOP Activity / Change 4 Life / Start to Play / Get Moving, Get Learning / Participation Award / Support with developing school /club link agreements.
- Increasing participation of underrepresented groups through bespoke provision. E.g. Girls Active.
- Working with Active Partnerships, Sports
   Development, Community Organisations and Clubs to improve school to community transition.
- Access to new national strategy opportunities offered to SSP - E.g. KS1 - FA Active Play through Storytelling.





# Dothill Primary School — Pupil Premium/Sport Provision

- Lead Governor for PE and School Sport and Dothill Primary School PE Coordinator meet regularly to ensure PE Premium funding is spent effectively.
- Many of our pupils identified as PPG attend 'Cool Kids' interventions. These are planned activities delivered in small groups with the aim of developing children's fine and gross motor skills. Within these sessions children are given opportunities to develop their bi-lateral movement, balance and co—ordination skills.

# Dothill Primary School — SEND Sport Provision

- Lead Governor for PE and School Sport and Dothill Primary School PE Coordinator meet regularly to ensure PE Premium funding is spent effectively.
- Dothill Primary School has attended several TWSSP Sportsability festivals throughout the year providing young people with SEND at Dothill opportunities to participate in lifelong physical activity.
- Staff at Dothill use the exercise programme 'Cool Kids' to support children to develop fine and gross motor skills. Children develop their bi-lateral movement, balance and co—ordination through a range of short activities delivered regularly.
- PE lessons at Dothill Primary School are carefully planned and differentiated appropriately to allow access to all pupils.
