please be mindful of how you park near to School. Causing an obstruction of the foot path /entrance to the School could put your child and others at risk of Injury.



Your vehicle has been seen parked causing an obstruction or an 'except for access' road. Please take some time to read this advisory leaflet.

The vast majority of people park in a considerate manner and if they park on a pavement it is only by a few inches, leaving enough room for a double buggy, large wheelchair or guide dog and owner to get past.

However, there are a minority of motorists that park fully on the pavement or up against street furniture making it impossible or extremely difficult to get past.

When a vehicle is parked on a pavement next to an overgrown hedge, lamp post or tree, the problem becomes worse.

A blind pavement user is either forced to go into the road which has inherent dangers that this brings, or more likely to end up with a face full of hedge or an injury from a tree branch.

An obstruction can also impact on access by emergency services vehicles.

Parking on pavements also causes cracked paving slabs, which can create further access problems for pedestrians.
