Spelling: Word Lists for Pupils to Learn

During the Early Years and in key stage 1, spelling is underpinned by pupils' developing phonic knowledge, together with a sight vocabulary of "tricky" words that are phonically irregular.

The 100 high frequency words below are important for young children to learn to read and spell so if parents and carers can help them to practice at home they will make really speedy progress!
