Use Morse Code to spell your words. It is a series of dots (1 count) and dashes (3 counts). Check out this site, <u>http://www.morsecode.dutch.nl/alphabet.html</u> to see the international (NATO) Morse Code so you can practice!



In a darkened room, use a flashlight to write your spelling words in the air.

Have a partner read your words as you write them OR your partner can "flash write" the words and your job is to read.
